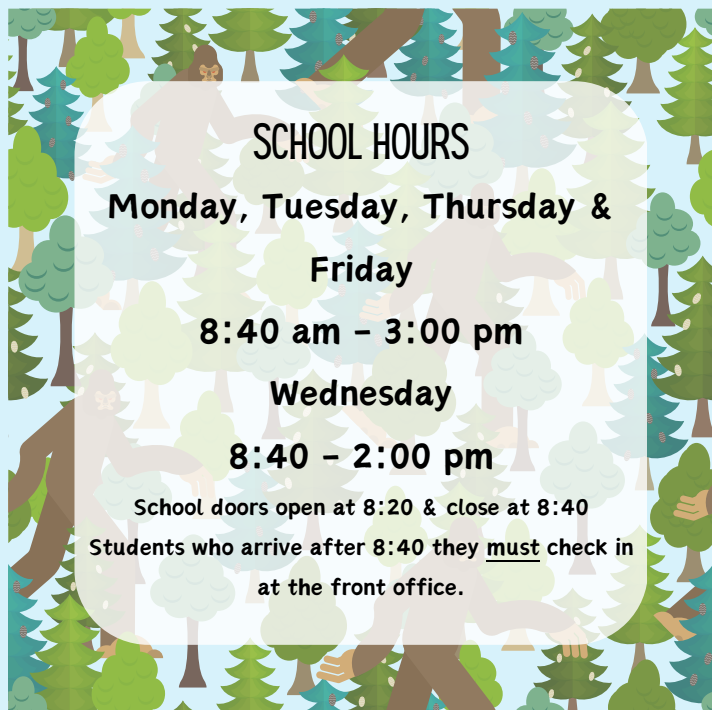

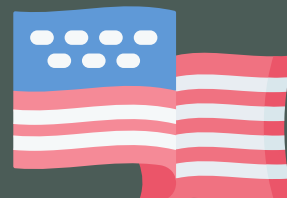

CAR LINE DISMISSAL PROCEDURES

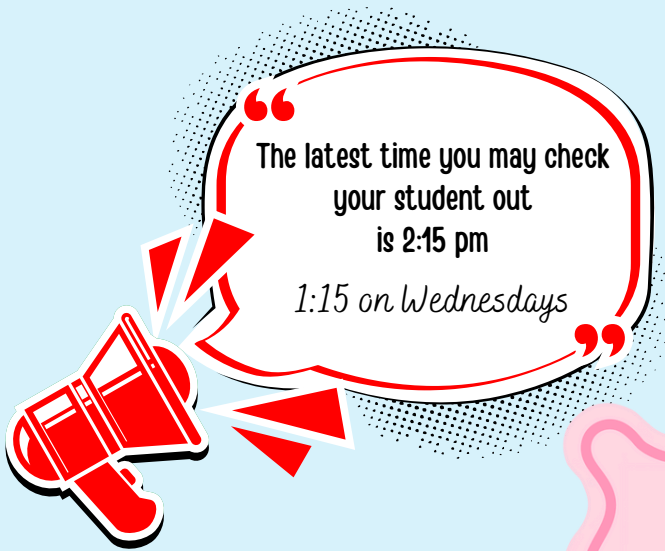
- Please hang your PIKMYKID number/name on your rear view mirror or place PIKMYKID card on dashboard so all staff can read.

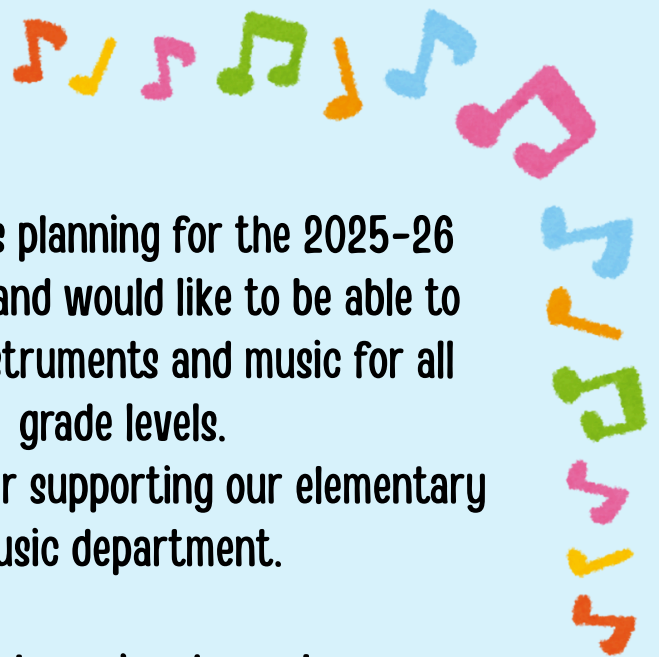
DONOR'S CHOOSE PROJECT

Wellness Corner

Flexibility is our forgotten superpower!!! Our bodies perform best when we are able to complete full range of movement. I would like to challenge us this month and over the summer to help our students increase their range of motion and flexibility. Our Youth Healthy Fitness Awards are provided to outgoing 5th graders who complete Healthy Fitness Levels in all 4 components of fitness: Cardiorespiratory Endurance, Muscular Endurance, Muscular Strength and Flexibility... We are noticing an increased need to help our students with flexibility earlier... So, I am offering this family challenge to add just 2 minutes of flexibility stretches to help our students gain the skills and practice to maintain and improve over their lifetimes.

<h2>Flexibility Challenge</h2> <p>Flexibility is your muscles, tendons, ligaments and soft tissue's ability to move in their full range of motion. Flexibility is often forgotten... I challenge our families to add these 2 minute exercises to help our students improve and maintain their flexibility.</p>

bike safety

Students riding bikes(pedaled or motorized) or electric scooters are required to wear a helmet to operate if under the age of 16.

We have well over 100 motorized vehicles on campus, those 100 students leave campus within 5 minutes of each other alongside the students walking and on pedaled bikes and scooters. A helmet can help protect everyone, especially a student that is impacted by a motorized bike or scooter.

Remember Teachers at Bike Racks are trying to help keep our students safe and bikes accessible without falling on others whenever possible

We do not ride any vehicle (bike, ebike, scooter, escooter) on school grounds – we walk bike to first pole then ride as you can see what is ahead of you then *** Our ebikes are going to fast making it dangerous when there is congestion - Please slow down!

Please do not block walkways, simply turn your bike into an open slot – bikes with kickstands do not need to go up an over a bike rack turn just place in a slot and put kickstand down

Please do not hang scooters nor double park/stack bikes – only one item per space on fence

Parents/Students should not pick up or drop off alongside of bike rack/bus loop/car rider areas

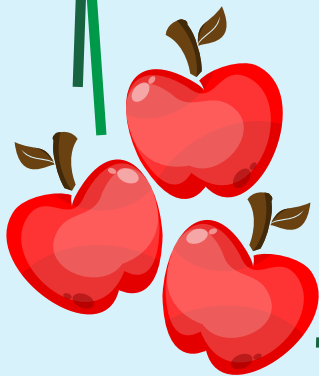

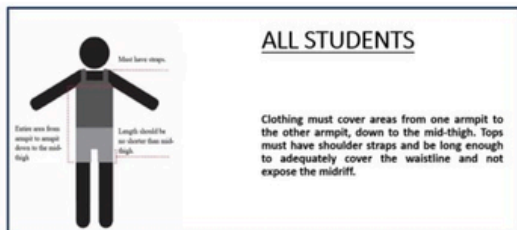

Middle School News

DRESS CODE POLICY

Dress Code Policy



ALL STUDENTS

Clothing must cover areas from one armpit to the other armpit, down to the mid-thigh. Tops must have shoulder straps and be long enough to adequately cover the waistline and not expose the midriff.

Reminders

- Clothing, piercings and accessories displaying profanity, violence, discriminatory messages, sexually suggestive phrases, symbols or phrases of alcohol, tobacco or drugs is unacceptable.
- Pajamas shall not be worn as exterior clothing on campus.
- Head gear, including but not limited to caps, hats, bandanas, and/or sunglasses should not be worn indoors.
- Students must wear shoes with backs that are safe for the learning environment. Bedroom slippers are prohibited.
- Rips or tears in clothing above the mid-thigh must not expose skin.

In accordance with statutory requirement F.S. 1006.07 (students are prohibited from wearing clothing that exposes underwear or that exposes body parts in an indecent or vulgar manner) enforcement will focus on positive guidance without embarrassment to the student and should not disrupt the educational process.

CELL PHONE POLICY

Phone Policy

Expectation: Upon entering school, phones and other wireless communication devices must be turned off and stored in student's backpack, purse, or locker. To assist students in maintaining academic focus, the device shall not be used during the school day without administrative approval.



Recording other students and staff is PROHIBITED

Failure to put phone away after teacher reminder will result in discipline consequences including confiscation of the device or loss of privilege to possess such a device on school campus as outlined in the Student Code of Conduct.

When there is reasonable suspicion that a student has used a cell phone in violation of the Code of Conduct or other school rules, or for an unlawful purpose, the school administration may search the phone's call logs, voice messages, text messages, photographs and any other applications in its investigation of the suspected violations.

Students can contact parents/guardians from a school phone if the need arises throughout the academic day.

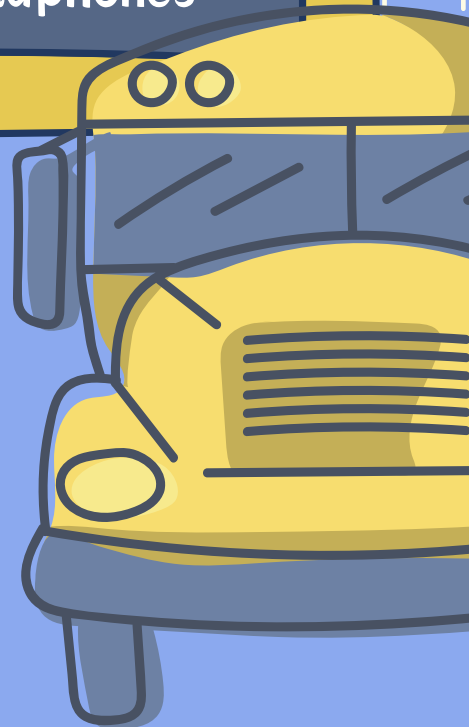

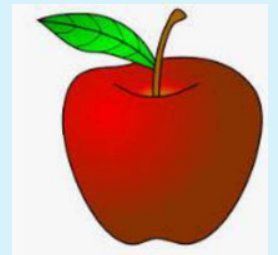
